We will meet on the first Tuesday of February, May, August and November of 2022. Our meetings will all be at 10 a.m. here at the church. The individual Circles will decide on the program and if they wish to provide lunch.

Our final "UMW" meeting will be this December 7 at 10a.m. with a Christmas program and a potluck luncheon. We invite each of you to join us for more discussion about our upcoming changes. Please come, especially if you have questions or comments about this.

To Whom It May Concern:

The Myrtle Grove United Methodist Church's United Methodist Women have voted to disengage from the National, Conference and District United Methodist Women's groups.
