It was available to all, but only those who accept it experience its regenerating power.

The Gospel is still available to all, so therefore, it must be shared with all.

Probably the most quoted scripture in the Bible tells us this in John 3:16: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life."

Friends, let's do our part here on earth in sharing the Gospel so that eternity will be the home of those we minister to.

Please be assured that we disinfect the nursery furniture and toys between every use and watch the children closely so that they do not share toys with each other. All children and workers take their temperature before checking any child into the nursery and even wipe the sign in pen down after each use. Changing diapers is limited to as needed only to limit each child's exposure to germs and all adults wear surgical gloves. For the time being, we are limiting snacks to what parents provide and placing them at the tables where they are restricted and cannot share their food. This has allowed our nursery to be as safe as possible during these challenging times. We are proud to say that we are prepared for growth with all of our nursery workers having background checks and being CPR trained.
