Senior Pastor's Note

Is March one of your favorite months of the Year? March is one of my favorite months because of a few things, like daylight savings time and the season of Lent! Lent is a forty-day season of preparation for the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday. The season begins on Ash Wednesday when pastors mark the foreheads of Christians with ashes as a reminder that we are created from dust and to dust we shall return. Ashes are also a symbol of repentance, an outward symbol for one's inner sorrow for having sinned. By putting ashes on our forehead, we are acknowledging that we have sinned and feel remorse for those sins.

A Biblical example of ashes being used as a symbol of repentance can be found in Job 42:6 in which Job says, "Therefore I despise myself and repent in dust and ashes" (NIV). Ashes used as a symbol of mourning can be found in 2nd Samuel 13:19: "Tamar put ashes on her head and tore the ornamented robe she was wearing. She put her hand on her head and went away, weeping aloud as she went" (NIV).

During The season of Lent, we follow Jesus from his adult ministry through his suffering during Holy Week which begins with Palm Sunday, also called the Sunday of the Passion, and continues through Holy Thursday (when Holy Communion was instituted at the Last Supper) and Good Friday, when Jesus was tried, crucified, and buried. Because the Last Supper was celebrated during the Feast of the Passover, which is calculated on the phases of the moon, Easter is called a movable feast. Lent is scheduled backwards from Easter. Easter falls on the first Sunday after the full moon after the spring equinox. The forty days of fasting and penitence during Lent do not include Sundays. Christians always celebrate Sunday as the day Jesus rose from the dead, so it is never a day of fasting.

Lent is a time of stripping down to essentials, as each Christian focuses on his or her individual relationship with God. It is a time when Christians remember our baptisms, when Jesus washed away our sins, giving us newness of life to celebrate in the triumph of Palm Sunday and the glory of Easter. I am convinced that the quality of your Easter celebration will be greater enhanced if you participate more fully in the Lent experience. What books are you going to read? What commitments will you make? What worship services will you attend? What action will you take? What are your plans for your Lenten journey? Have you made any? If you have not, let me encourage you to take the season of Lent more seriously! If you are not sure what to do, give me a call or visit. I have some wonderful ideas! I hope and pray your journey through Lent will be one that erupts in praise and thanksgiving on Easter Sunday!

Annual Conference for Myrtle Grove UMC

Our UMC Annual Conference in June will again be accepting donations of items for UMCOR (United Methodist Committee On Relief). For the last several years, we have asked you to pack school kits for us to carry to the conference. Here are the items needed:

UMCOR School Kits - For Annual Conference

In some countries, children don't have books or school supplies. Many have no schoolrooms; classes are held in inadequate or half-destroyed buildings, tents, or even the open air. School kits may be these children's only educational resources.

School Kit Materials

 One pair blunt scissors
 *Round tip only
 * No plastic scissors

 One box of 24 crayons
 *Only 24-count boxes are accepted

 Three one-subject notebooks
 *No marble composition books
 *No 3 or 5-subject notebooks

 One pack of loose-leaf paper
 *100-200 page packets are acceptable
 *Wide or college rule accepted

 One hand-held pencil sharpener
 *1-inch or longer
 *Remove from packaging

 One ruler
 *12 inches or 30 centimeters long
 *Sturdy or flexible material accepted

 Six unsharpened pencils
 One eraser
 *Two inches or larger

 One two-gallon re-sealable plastic bag
 Event
 Event

Assembly Directions: *Stack all paper items on top of each other *Place all loose items on top of paper. (Small loose items may be placed in a smaller re-sealable bag.) *Place kit inside of re-sealable bag and seal.

Important Notes *Homemade or purchased cloth tote bags are <u>no longer being accepted</u>. *All items <u>must be</u> <u>new</u>. *Please do not include any personal notes, money or additional materials in the kits. *Contents of kits or the containers of kits should not be imprinted with cartoon characters, advertisements, religious, patriotic, military or camouflage symbols.

Should you desire to help without completing a full school kit, our Pensacola District is being asked to send just the Erasers (2" or larger) and/or you may donate combs for the Hygiene Kits (sturdy comb with at least 6" of teeth, no pocket combs or picks; rattail combs and combs without handles are acceptable).

All items should be turned in at church no later than May 29 for us to carry to Annual Conference on June 2-5, 2019.
