

A FEW THINGS YOU MAY NOT KNOW ABOUT MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR.

Martin Luther King, Jr. was born on January 15, 1929, in Atlanta, Georgia, the second child of Martin Luther King Sr., a pastor, and Alberta Williams King, a former schoolteacher. His birth name was actually Michael. but his father was inspired by the legacy of Martin Luther when he traveled to Germany and decided to change not only his 5 year old son's name, but his own name as well. He grew up in the city's Sweet Auburn neighborhood, then home to some of the most prominent and prosperous African Americans in the country.

A gifted student, King attended segregated public schools and at the age of 15 was admitted to Morehouse College, the alma mater of both his father and maternal grandfather, where he studied medicine and law. Although he had not intended to follow in his father's footsteps by joining the ministry, he changed his mind under the mentorship of Morehouse's president, Dr. Benjamin Mays, an influential theologian and outspoken advocate for racial equality. After graduating in 1948, King entered Crozer Theological Seminary in Pennsylvania, where he earned a Bachelor of Divinity degree, won a prestigious fellowship and was elected president of his predominantly white senior class.

During the tumultuous civil rights era, Martin Luther King, Jr. was incarcerated 29 times. Charges were mostly for his demonstrations and labeled Civil Disobedience. There were charges, however, for things such as going 5 miles an hour over the speed limit. There was another assassination attempt on his life when a woman stabbed him in his chest with a letter opener at one of his book signings. He had to undergo very delicate surgery to repair the damage.

In 1983, President Ronald Reagan signed a bill to make Martin Luther King Jr. Day a Federal holiday. He is the only American except Presidents Washington and Lincoln to have a Federal holiday named for him.

"Be a bush if you can't be a tree. If you can't be a highway, just be a trail. If you can't be a sun, be a star. For it isn't by size that you win or fail. Be the best of whatever you are."
